The first time I met Sherry we were in early grade school. Her great aunt was our next door neighbor and looked after me after school until my mother got home from work.

We couldn't have been more different. She was a dark haired, slim girl who preferred playing rough and ready and I had thick blonde braids and played with dolls. We entered the same Junior High School and recognized each other. Both of us were a little shy about the crowds of kids from all over town who entered 7th grade. We ate lunch together and had sleepovers, shared our thoughts on boys and art, what we wanted to do after graduating. She went off to college and I married a classmate, setting up household in an apartment. She'd come to see me when home for holidays and summer. I was a young mother at 18 then 21, she met a boy in college, married and wound up living in California. We wrote letters, talked on the phone, and a few times she and her daughter came to visit.

Over the years there were divorces, remarriages, meet ups in California, Freeport, and once a shared visit in New York right after Christmas.

Tonight we had one of our long phone visits. We share the same views on life, values, and hopes for our country. We talked about our teachers from Jr. and Sr. High and how much we liked them and the high regard we had for several in particular. We are 81 and sometimes talk about aging, health changes, medications, and the usual aches and pains.

If you are lucky enough to have long term friends you are indeed fortunate. My longtime friend knows more about me than anyone else. We are witnesses to our early years, teens, school days from Jr. High to high school. We knew each other's boyfriends, husbands, other friends in our school circle, and now sharing those memories as we look back together.
